## The Fall River Women's Program

A Long Term Residential Treatment Program

Serving Women with Substance Use Disorders and their Infants in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts



# What can I expect if I participate in the program?

The Fall River Women's Therapeutic Community provides twenty-eight beds for women and women with infants with substance use problems. The building is a three story structure providing a comfortable, sober, home-like environment. Women participate in the program from three to twelve months as they work on developing recovery skills and support systems. Women are also assisted with obtaining employment, entitlements, parenting skills, and living and coping skills as well as finding appropriate housing prior to discharge. These skills, services, and supports empower women so they successfully transition into the community and experience long term sobriety and an improved quality of life.

Sometimes our lives have to be completely shaken up, changed, and rearranged to relocate us to the place we are meant to be. The Women Program was the answer for me. My life has forever changed ~Michele

## Who is eligible?

You must be 18 years of age or older, living in Massachusetts, alcohol and drug free and medically and psychologically stabilized.

## How do I apply?

Referrals are received from social service agencies, addiction centers, and self referred. An initial screening assessment is obtained by calling 508 674-2788 ext. 101. If criteria is met an intake assessment is conducted on-site. Upon acceptance you will be placed on a waiting list and required to contact the program weekly with your continued interest in the program.

The Women's Therapeutic Community is funded by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health Bureau of Substance Abuse Services and Mass Health. No one is denied admission due to lack of insurance or ability to pay.

### What Services are offered?

Individual, group and family counseling

Comprehensive case management services for pregnant and post-partum women, and their infants

Comprehensive case management services for homeless and chronically homeless

Comprehensive educational components related to all aspects of recovery

Employment training and placement assistance

12 Step meetings and other AA/NA recovery related activities

Trauma informed care

Structured recreational opportunities

Referrals to community-based collateral services, educational opportunities, medical care, domestic violence and other forms of assistance.

Housing placement assistance

Discharge and aftercare planning
