Bristol County Reentry Project

Serving Individuals incarcerated in Bristol County House of Corrections and/or supervised by probation or parole in Bristol County, Massachusetts







What can I expect if I participate in the program?

Bristol County Reentry Project (BCRP) provides services that promote long-term recovery from substance use and co-occurring disorders with the goal of reducing recidivism. A reentry plan is tailored around the unique needs of individuals being served. Each participant is encouraged and guided in driving the goals and objectives of the plan as he or she progresses through the different stages of reentry and recovery.

Who is eligible?

All applicants must be at least 18 years of age and have a substance use disorder. The following individuals will be considered for admission: men and women incarcerated in the Bristol County House of Correction, probationers or parolees who have violated conditions of probation or parole in the community who have been returned to custody, or who are at risk of being returned to custody.

How do I apply?

Referral forms can be obtained through your unit caseworker at the Bristol County House of Correction. When appropriate, 3rd District Court Probation Department or Region 8 Parole will identify and refer persons who may benefit from Bristol County Reentry Services. Once completed, your referral form will be sent to the Bristol County Reentry Project for review by the Project Director. Once accepted, the BCRP will notify you through the reentry department at Bristol County House of Correction, Probation or Parole offices to begin services.
