

# What can I expect if I participate in the program?

The First Step Inn provides safe shelter and daily nutritious meals to homeless persons in the City of Fall River. Case management services offered at the First Step Inn connect guests to housing, employment, mainstream resources, primary and behavioral healthcare, and an array of other services.

Guests are assisted with locating and securing permanent housing and have access to wraparound supports to ensure continued stability.

These comprehensive supportive services are offered in a safe, comfortable environment and enable guests to successfully transition into the community and experience housing stability and an improved quality of life.

My tent burnt down in a fire. I was and Compare trying to keep warm. I lost everything and ended up at the First Step Inn. I don't have to worry about being hungry and warm right now and will be working with a case manager. ~ Manager.

# Who is eligible?

Eligible guests must be 18 years of age or older, homeless or chronically homeless in Fall River, MA, and medically and psychologically stable. Guests must be willing to authorize a CORI check, as well as submit to a safety search upon admission. A picture ID is required.

# How do I apply?

All referrals, including those from social service agencies, homeless providers, addiction centers, and self-referrals, must go through Fall River's Coordinated Entry System, "The CALL", which can be reached by calling 1-800-HOMELESS. If criteria are met, an individual seeking assistance must be pre-screened before receiving services. The screening hours are between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

The First Step Inn receives Housing and Urban Development Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funding through the MA Department of Housing and Community Development and the City of Fall River as well as proceeds from the annual Get Steppin' Walk fundraiser.

### What services are offered?

Food and nutritional assistance

Safe and secure sleeping environment

Discharge and aftercare planning
